<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Moses was to be as God to Pharaoh and Aaron his prophet (1) - God will harden Pharaoh's heart - God wants the people to see His wonders (3) - My hosts, My people (My = possessive pronoun) (4) - Hosts = organized grouping - God's instrument (army) of action - that He is leading to take the land of Canaan - People = these are God's people, and they are NOT Pharaoh's slaves - God will show Pharaoh that he doesn't own them - They will know that I am the Lord (5) - The battle between God and Pharaoh - it will not be general but very specific so they will recognize God's hand (9:20; 12:38) - Pharaoh demanded something to prove the validity of Moses's God (9) - 9-13 (II Tim 3:8) - secret arts - witchcraft - Aaron's staff eats the others - 14 - Pharaoh's heart is stubborn - 16 - Let MY people go to serve Me - 20-25 - the water turns to blood (Hapi - god of the Nile) - he couldn't protect it 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1 - Moses goes to Pharaoh - palace? - 2-6 - frogs - Heqt (Heket, Heqet) - she was symbol of resurrection and fertility - can't kill a frog - a frog amulet would be held and quote "I am the resurrection" (Khnum - husband) - 7 - magicians - do the same thing - 8-9 when do you want the frogs to disappear - Tomorrow - was the deadline - he would know that there was no one like the Lord - Pharaoh wouldn't acknowledge God - he hardened his heart (10-15) - Plague #3 - gnats (lice) - small biting insects - all the land of Egypt (16) - Severity (16-17) - Magicians see the hand of God (18-19) - Geb - god over the dust of the earth - Pharaoh's heart is still hard - Plague #4 - back to the Nile - swarms of flies - God makes a division between His people and the Egyptians (20-24) - Khepri - god of creation, movement of the sun, rebirth - head of a fly (25-32) - You can go as far as I say you can go 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1-7 - very severe plague tomorrow - Goddess Hathor - love and protection (but can't protect) - Distinction between Egypt and Israel - no Jewish cattle will be touched - All the livestock (in the field) died - Hardening of Pharaoh 8-12 - they were to take soot from a kiln - used to bake bricks - Boils effect everyone including the magicians - Isis goddess of medicine and peace - Rom 1:18-25 - path of sin Pharaoh follows as his heart gets darker and harder 13-17 - they will know there is no one on all the earth like God - God has allowed Pharaoh to stay in power - in order to show My power and exalt My name throughout the earth 18-26 - the people had a choice - Distinction between Israel & Egypt - Hail, fire - Pharaoh didn't fear God - Heart is hardened again 27-35 - confession of sin was without repentance

<p>1-11</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pharaoh continues to refuse - Plague of locusts is going to come - The servants are giving in - let the men go - Aaron and Moses are driven from his presence <p>12-17</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - locusts eat everything that was left from the hail - Pharaoh realizes that he is pushing God and God is pushing back - He acknowledges his sin - but only this once <p>18-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - destruction and devastation still isn't enough to bring Pharaoh to his knees <p>21-29</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - without warning - Darkness that can be felt - No one could leave their place - But Israel had light (Goshen) - Attack against Ra - king of deities (sun) - Partial softening - not giving in - Moses threatened with death - but he acknowledges that he won't see Pharaoh again (in this way) 	<p>1-3</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pharaoh will be compelled - Speak to their neighbors and ask for silver, gold - They had found favor in the eyes of the people - respected and feared God - They were esteemed in everyone's eyes except Pharaoh's <p>4-8</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - firstborn of Egypt will die - Cry throughout the land of Egypt but not a sound from God's people <p>9-10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pharaoh would not listed - God's wonders would be seen throughout the land - Pharaoh saw it all - hardened his heart - so God would be seen 	<p>1-13</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - beginning of the year to them - 10th day they were to pick a lamb - Unblemished, male, year old (sheep or the goats) - Keep it until the 14th day - Whole assembly will kill them at twilight - Blood would be applied to the doorposts and the lintel - Roasted with fire, eaten with unleavened bread - None is to be left over for morning - You are eating this in haste - Bitter herbs - God will come through the land to judge the gods of Egypt - those who worship them - Firstborn will die except for those who are in the house with the blood applied to their doors - Pharaoh summons Moses at night and tells him to leave - The people wanted them to leave before all the Egyptians were dead (33-36) - Plundered Egypt (Gen 15:13-14) - 600,000 men aside from children (37-41) - Mixed multitude (38) - 430 years to the day (40-41) - Gal 3:17 - No outsider can celebrate (43-49)
