| <p>1-3 Mo-ed - appointed times Convocations - a calling together, a rehearsal</p> <p>Sabbath -complete rest-He 4:1- 13 - rest from work - no laborious work</p> <p>Spring Feasts - March/April - barley harvest (4-14)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Passover - Feast of Unleavened Bread - First Fruits (Sunday) <p>Feast of Weeks - Feast of Pentecost - counting the omer - May/June - wheat harvest (15-21)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - day after 7 Sabbaths - 50 days - Present a grain offering - fine flour - leavened - Animal offerings - burnt, sin, peace offerings - wave - NT - coming of the Holy Spirit <p>Leaving produce for the poor and needy (22)</p> <p>Fall Feasts - 7th month - Sept/Oct - Rosh Hashanah - grape harvest</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 1st day - Feast of Trumpets - Yom Teruah - Day of Shouting or blasting (23-25) - 10th day - Day of Atonement - Yom Kippur - humbling yourself before God (26-32) - 15th day - Day of Booths, Feast of Tabernacles - (8 days) - dwelling with the Lord | <p>1-4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - bringing in clear oil from beaten olives - light the lamp in the tabernacle - Kept continually before the Lord <p>5-9</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - fine flour - 12 cakes - 2/10s of an ephah (4 qts of flour) - 2 rows - 6 on each - memorial portion - for the the priests - Frankincense on each row - Changes out every Sabbath | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - this man blasphemed the Name and cursed - Put him in custody - and then sought the Lord - All who heard him put their hands on his head - indication of his guilt - All the congregation is to stone him |

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - if a man takes the life of another man - he shall be put to death - If a man kills an animal that belongs to another man - make it right life for life - Man injures his neighbor - eye for eye, tooth for tooth - Rules are for the stranger as well as the native - Punishment was swift - Punishment was not partial | <p>1-7 - sabbath year - 7th year</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 6 years you plant and harvest, 7th year the land rests - You have the 7th year's products - Your cattle and animals can have the crops - Revitalizing the land <p>8-12 - Year of Jubilee - release from indebtedness and bondage - time of restoration</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - count off 49 years and then on the 7th month, 10th day we sound the horn and initiate the year of Jubilee - Day of Atonement - People are set free from the bondage of slavery/indebtedness - Don't sow, reap, gather <p>13-17 - don't wrong one another with the valuation of your property or servitude</p> <p>18-22 -following My commands</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - I will give you crops (for 3 years on the 6th year) - They would dwell securely in their land <p>23-28 - the law of redemption</p> <p>29-34 - Exemptions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - house in walled city needs to be redeemed in 1 year or it permanently belongs to the purchaser - City of the Levites <p>35-38 - if a country man becomes poor you are to sustain him - don't take usurious interest (usury)</p> <p>39-46 - difference between country and bought slaves</p> | |
