<p>Job character</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - taught many, strengthened the weak (4:3) - Help the stumbling stand (4:4) - plowing or sowing wickedness will reap judgment at some time (4:8) - Gal 6:7-9; I Pet 3:12 - man can't be righteous enough before God (4:17-21) - Man is born for trouble (5:7) - God does discipline those He loves (5:17) He 12:4-6 - God inflicts pain and gives relief, He wounds and He heals (5:18) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - distress comes to you - your impatient (4:5) - It touches you and your horrified - Isn't your fear of God your confidence? (4:6) - Isn't your integrity your hope? - You've sown evil and trouble - now you reap it (4:8) - You are not holy enough (4:17-21) - There is no one to save a fool (5:2-5) - Despising God's disciple (5:17) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - righteous will prosper and the wicked will suffer (4:7) - Not everything we reap in this life is something that we have sown (4:8) - II Cor 12:7-10 - purpose for the suffering but God's grace is sufficient - Jn 9:1-3 - You are not holy enough (4:17-21) - There is no one you can turn to - not God, not the angels (5:1) - The good are always honored and the evil are always captured or stopped (5:11-15) - Job is being disciplined by God (5:17) - Evil will not touch God's followers (5:19-27) - Even the earth will be at peace with you

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - I haven't denied God - even in my pain (6:10) - There should be kindness from a friend - encouragement to stand strong in the Lord (6:14) - You have deceitfully like a dry stream (wash, wadi) (6:15-19) - I haven't asked you for anything (6:21-23) - Show me what I've done wrong (6:24-27) - Am I lying to you (6:28) - Is there injustice in me (6:30) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - my grief and disaster have overtaken me and if weighed would be heavier than the sands of the seas (6:2-3) - Good has been taken away from me (6:11-13) - Person laboring through the day (7:1-2) - Nights just continue to drag on (7:3-4) - Physical pain and agony - the days drag on without hope (7:5-6) - He will never see good again (7:7) - There is nothing for him (7:8-10) - Out of anguish - I have no peace (7:11-14) - He would choose death over the pain (7:15-16) - Have I sinned? - What have I done? - You have made me Your target (7:20) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - God alone has power over life and death (6:8-9) - God watches over man - examines him every moment (7:17-19)
