- B. Paul's Example Remember he was in prison when writing Philippians

 - 2. for me to live is Christ (Phil 1:21)
 - 3. he has suffered (II Tim 1:12)
 - 4. he endured all for the sake of the elect (II Tim 2:10)
 - 5. allows himself to be poured out as a drink offering (II Tim 4:6)
 - 6. fought the good fight (II Tim 4:7)
 - 7. finished the course
 - 8. kept the faith

Paul's impact is made because he lived the word! He practice what he preached!

His goal - He wanted to please God in all things (Gal 1:10)
