In Christ - set free from the law of sin and death (2) - Don't walk in flesh - we walk according to the Spirit (4) - Set our minds not on things of flesh but on the Spirit (5) - Mindset of flesh is hostile to God (7-8) - Not in the flesh but in the Spirit (9) - Not under obligation to the flesh (12) - We live by the Spirit and put to death the deeds of the flesh (13) - Being led by the Spirit of God (14)	He is talking to Christians 1 - "as to" is used 3 times = comparative adverb = Paul is comparing the brethren saying I can't talk to you as spiritual I will talk to you like men of flesh I will talk to you like an infant They are acting like a bunch of babies - Grow up!
