BUT - Jn 14:6; Mt 7:13  - Jesus said He is the only way to the Father  - Narrow way leads to life - the broad way to destruction and death | <ul> <li>13:3-7</li> <li>no wine or strong drink</li> <li>Don't eat anything unclean</li> <li>No razor to touch his head</li> <li>Shall be a Nazarite from the womb to death (not Samson's choice - but an appointed position)</li> <li>He will begin to deliver Israel from the Philistines</li> <li>Num 6</li> <li>dedicate himself to the Lord (2)</li> <li>No vinegar, grape juice, grapes - nothing that comes from the vines</li> <li>Not to go near anything dead (6-8)</li> <li>Samson did not voluntarily choose this - it was decided for him by God</li> </ul> | <ul> <li>it was time for Israel to be shaken out of their seduction</li> <li>Something needed to happen</li> <li>At the exact right time - God raises up Samson</li> <li>Nazarite vows set Samson apart from all others - different than the world</li> <li>Samson was drawn to the Philistines - specifically the women</li> <li>14:1-4</li> <li>God would use Samson's weakness for Philistine women to bring the relationship between Israel and the Philistines to an end</li> </ul> |
