<p>Greek Septuagint - 200's BC?</p> <p>Greek translation of the Hebrew OT</p> <p>72 men - scholars from Jerusalem that understood both Greek and Hebrew - 6 from each tribe</p> <p>72 days the translated the whole thing</p> <p>Septuagint - Greek word meaning 70</p> <p>Mistranslation of Dt 17:18 - instead of copy of this law they translated it as second law</p> <p>"Second Law" translated Deuteronomium in the Latin (deuteros = second; nomos = law)</p> <p>Hebrew Title - "These are the Words" - Dt 1:1</p> <p>Last of the 5 books of the Pentateuch (pente = 5; teukhos = scroll or book)</p>	<p>Moses (1:1, 5; 31:9, 22, 24)</p> <p>Old Testament - 4 times I Ki 2:3; 8:53; II Ki 14:6; 18:12</p> <p>New Testament - 2 times Acts 3:22-23; Ro 10:19</p> <p>Dt 32:45-34:12 - the end of the book was finished by Joshua</p> <p>Written within a month of Moses dying</p>	<p>2nd generation of the exodus slaves</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - some were children or teens that had left Egypt and come to the Mountain of God - Others were those who were born during the journey - 60 and younger - Joshua and Caleb were the old men <p>Most of these people were not there when the 10 commandments was given at the mountain</p> <p>Contains a lot of legal details for the people not for the priests (like Leviticus)</p> <p>Reminders</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - they are rebellious (9:7-10:11; 1:26-46) - God's Faithfulness - The land is theirs <p>Moses tells them that they will fail at being obedient and God would scatter them</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) the Lord is the only God (4:39; 6:4) 2) He is jealous (4:24) 3) He is faithful (7:9) 4) He is loving (7:13) 5) He is merciful (4:31) 6) Angered by sin (6:15) 7) He is their God - He has called His people to Himself 8) He called them to obey (28:2); fear (10:12); love (10:12); to serve Him (10:12) - walk in His ways keeping, His commands <p>Obedience will bring blessing (28:1-14)</p> <p>Pursuit of personal Holiness - based on the character of God</p> <p>Matt 5:48 - pursuing perfection</p> <p>Matt 7:13-27 - we need to live according to the Word of God</p>

<p>1-5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - When? - 40th year, 1st day, 11 month - Where? - Across the Jordan in the land of Moab - Who? Why? - words of Moses spoke according to all that the Lord had commanded him to give them - What? - expound the law <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - make it clear, plain, this was their guide to the law - 11 day journey from Horeb to Kadesh-barnea by the way of Mt Seir <p>6-8 - go take your land 9-15 - appointment of heads of the tribes to handle disputes 16-18 - judgment without partiality 19-25 - you were sent into the land for a plan 26-33 - they did not trust the Lord 34-40 - they were forced to wander in the wilderness 41-46 - they rebelled against God</p>	<p>1-7</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - circle Mt Seir for many days - Passed through Edom (Esau) - Gen 32:3; 33:16; 36:8,9 <p>8-15</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Moabites - they were not to harass them - God gave that land to Lot (Gen 19:30-38) <p>16-25</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ammonites - don't harass them (descendants of Lot) - Anakim, Rephaim, Zamzummin, Anak - giants - God would put fear in the hearts of the nations because of Israel <p>26-37</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - they began to take the land to the east of the River Jordan - God delivered it to them
