<p>not please ourselves (15:1)</p> <p>please our neighbor - for his good to his edification (15:2)</p> <p>Christ is our example - He was not here to please Himself (15:3)</p> <p>through perseverance and encouragement of Scriptures we might have hope (15:4)</p> <p>through Christ we can be of one mind to glorify God (15:5-6)</p>	<p>accept one another (15:7)</p> <p>Christ accepted us</p> <p>Jesus became a servant (15:8-9)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - to the Jews to confirm the promises - to the Gentiles to glorify God (cf Phil 2:7; John 13:6-20; I Tim 5:10; Mark 9:35) <p>OT passages - show hope coming through Jesus (15:9-12)</p> <p>fill you with joy and peace so that you will abound in hope (15:13)</p> <p>full of goodness, knowledge, and able to admonish one another (15:14)</p> <p>this is a reminder of God's grace (15-15)</p> <p>how do we know that people have accepted the Lord - obedience by word and deed (18-19)</p> <p>take the word to those who haven't heard (20-21)</p>	<p>busy preaching (22)</p> <p>longing in the heart to minister to various people (23-25)</p> <p>Gentiles are indebted to the Jews for salvation (26)</p> <p>sharing of material things with those who have blessed us with spiritual things (27)</p> <p>strive together in prayer (30)</p> <p>Paul had plans, but God has His own plans (31-32)</p>
