Prophecy of Exile - 12	Other Prophecies and Fulfillments
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ezekiel is to be sign to the house of Israel - Gathers up his baggage, climbs through the wall and leaves in their sight (1-6) - He obeyed and did as he was commanded (7) - 591 BC - when this was prophesied - They are 5 years away from the destruction of Jerusalem - Zedekiah is the king (prince) of Jerusalem - He will go into exile (11) - Go at night and dig through the wall (12) - He will be caught - God's snare (13) - He will be brought to Babylon but will not see it, will die there (13) - Some will be spared to tell of their abominations and God's righteous judgment (14-16) - The land will be stripped bare - they will know that I am God (17-20) - coming because of their violence - Proverb = it has been a long time and nothing has happened - it won't come to be - God assures them that judgment is coming! (21-25) - The time has come (26-28) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Jer 25:1-2, 11-12 - They will all serve the king of Babylon for 70 years - Jer 28:1-11 - Hananiah had a different message that the people liked - within 2 years we will be free of Babylon - Jeremiah doesn't dispute because the people don't want to hear - The prophet whose message comes true is the true prophet <p>Jeremiah 29</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Build houses and settle in (70 years) (4-6) - Seek the welfare of Babylon (7) - Don't listen to the false prophets (8-9) - God has a plan to give them a future and a hope (10-14) - This has come because they haven't listened to God (15-20) - Rebuke of those who don't obey (21-28) - Trust in a lie - preached rebellion (29-32) <p>Jer 52:1-16 (II Kings 25:1-7)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Zed rebels against Babylon - There is 1 1/2 years of siege - Walls are broken down - Zed flees at night and is caught - His sons and royals are brought before him and killed - He is blinded and brought to Babylon - He dies there

False Prophets Condemned - 13	Idolatrous Elders Condemned - 14
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- false prophets who are prophesying their own imaginations and saying it is from the Lord (1-7)- They are plastering the walls with whitewash - they will not stand! - God will tear down the walls and those who plastered the walls (8-16)- Women prophesying from their own imaginations - they are making magic bands - hunting lives (17-19)- God will deliver His people from their hands (20-23)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- the idols have separated them from God (1-5)- Idols of the heart- They set them before their faces as a stumbling block of iniquity- God says they shouldn't come to Him- God wants their hearts- When we separate from God - we set up idols in our heart (6-8) - I Thes 1:8-10- God's heart in punishment is always to turn people's hearts to Himself - to no longer stray or defile themselves (9-11)- Righteousness, walking with the Lord, wisdom, faith, obedience, blameless, feared God, reverent, heir of righteousness, turn away from evil, determination not to defile himself - they are delivered because of where their faith is placed (12-20)- Those who are brought through are for a purpose that they will know that I am God (21-23)
