I am helping inmates with the GED's, ASVAB (for military service), and some simply need to learn how to read, so they can function in life. Jim is making contacts and gathering information to help inmates as they leave, so they can plug into continued GED classes or connect with resources that can help them on a road to become useful members of society and make wise choices. Our goal is to share the gospel with them through our love, lives, words, and concern because we know that unless God changes the heart, they will not change. Ideas and plans are taking shape as to how we can not only teach the basics of education, but also give them the opportunity to hear God's Word. We are looking forward to seeing where God is leading in this endeavor.

By Thanksgiving, it became obvious to her children that she was getting worse. By January she was in the hospital, and in February, I flew to down to be with her when she passed. I have many fond memories of our times together, and I know that she is at peace, resting in the arms of Jesus. What blessed assurance we can have when we have entered into a covenant relationship with Jesus as our personal Lord and Savior!
