<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Uz? - near Babylon (Iraq/Saudi Arabia) (1:1) - Blameless, upright, feared God, turned from evil (1:1, 8; 2:3) - 10 children (1:2) - Greatest of all men in the east (1:3) - Job acted as priest on behalf of his family (1:4-5) - Lost everything - children, possessions, servants - Humility, reverence, mourning - turns to worship - the Lord gives the Lord takes away - blessed be the name of the Lord (1:20-22) - He did not sin he did not blame God! - Unselfishness, steadfastness, close relationship (understanding) of God, FAITH, purpose was to serve God (Job 19:25) (James 1:2-4) - Holds fast his integrity - even when ruined without cause (2:3) - Afflicted with boils (2:7) - Shall we accept good from God and not adversity (2:10) - 3 friends - came to sympathize and comfort (2:11) - Pain is great (2:13) <p>James 1:26-27; 5:10-11; 1:2-4</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - God calls attention to Job (1:8; 2:3) - God is teaching Satan about what faithfulness truly is - Allows Satan to touch Job, but God sets the parameters 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - presented himself before God (1:6; 2:1) - Roams about the earth (1:7; 2:2) - Thinks that man's only motivation to fear God is what he gets out of it (1:9-11) - Asks God to remove the hedge of protection from around him (1:11) - Satan took all that Job had (possessions) - Offers Pride, arrogance, selfishness (self-centeredness), possessions - Satan continues to pursue getting Job to fall - physical body <p>Who is Satan</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Mt 4:1-11 - tempter - takes and distorts God's Word - Lk 22:31-32 - Satan wants to shake our faith - II Cor 11:14 - Satan disguises himself as an angel of light - I Tim 3:6-7 - puffing up the mind and then setting snares for us - I Tim 5:15 - draw people away to follow after him - James 4:7 (I John 4:4) - resist the devil by submitting to God - I Peter 5:8 - prowling about like a roaring lion - seeking someone to devour
