 16 harlot in Gaza (1-3) Tears out the city gates and carries them to top of mountain Delilah - deceives Samson and finds the secret to his strength Captured, imprisoned, and died as he brought down the house of the Philistines 	Relationship to God: - cried out to God for water (15:18-19) - Called out for vengeance against the Philistines (16:28) Did what was right in his own eyes - chasing women, taking his own recourse for the Philistines actions	Ministry - called Israel to return to the Lord (I Sam 7:3) - Gathered Israel to pray for them (I Sam 7:5) - Cried out to the Lord (I Sam 7:9) Result of Ministry - Israel confessed their sins (I Sam 7:6) - Removed the Ba'als (I Sam 7:4) - Lord delivered them from the Philistines (I Sam 7:14)
