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Baptism Vs Circumcision	What Happened To Us?
<p>Baptism</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - #G908 - act of dipping something - #G907 - root word - baptizo - immerse, submerge, to make whelmed (fully wet) <p>Col 2:9-15 Rom 6:1-11</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - buried with Him in death, so we could walk with Him in newness of life - Old self has been crucified (it is dead) - Body of sin is done away with - No longer slaves to sin - We now live for God in Christ Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit <p>Circumcision</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - #G4059 - peritemno - #G4061 - peritome - To cut around or cut off - Spiritually - cutting off or putting off the body of sin (flesh) - Initiated in Gen 17 - sign of the covenant - Obedience that is going to be the sign of the covenant relationship <p>Both talk about a cleansing from the old sin nature</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rom 6:6 - II Cor 5:17 	<p>Col 2:13-14</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - dead in our transgressions - He made us alive together with Him - forgave our transgressions - Canceled the certificate of debt - Nailed it to the cross (Phil 3:18-19) <p>#G3900 - paratoma - to fall, lapse or deviation from truth, sin, misdeed, can be unintentional error or willful sin</p> <p>#G3847 - parabasis - a going over (or stepping over), disregarding, violating - only used 8 times in Scripture</p> <p>#G266/#G264 - hamartia - sin, to miss the mark, wandered from the path of uprightness and honor, violated divine law</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - omission or commission in thought, feeling, speech, action <p>Biblical definition of sin</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - James 4:17 - to know the right thing to do and not do it is sin - I John 3:4 - lawlessness - don't abide by the law - I Jn 5:17 - all unrighteousness is sin - Ro 14:23 - whatever is not from faith is sin <p>Eph 2:1-10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - dead in our trespasses and sins (paraptoma, hamartia) - God's love and mercy reached out - He made us alive together with Christ - Raised us up to the heavenly places
