<p>1-6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - concluded that Job is guilty, unrepentant - Empty talker, boastful, and a scoffer (2-3) - You maintain your innocence - this is empty talk (4) - If God would speak He would agree with us (5) - You need to understand the secrets of God (6) 	<p>7-12</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - God's depths and limits are unknowable (7) - Depths, height, length, breadth - more than we can ever comprehend (7-9) - No one can restrain God (10) - God knows the false and sees injustice (11) 	<p>13-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - devote yourself to God - Seek for forgiveness - Put sin far away from you - Don't let sin dwell in tents (13-14) <p>IF you do this THEN (15-19)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - lift up your face - Forget your troubles - Life would be brighter - Darkness would be gone - Trust, hope, rest securely - No one would disturb you

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - surely wisdom will die with you, my friends (12:2) - I know these things (12:3) - The upright man has become a joke to you (12:4) - I am contemptible to you (12:5) - Your reasoning is wrong (12:6) - Let the animals teach you (12:7-10) - Your advice goes against what we observe - You hear and speak what suits you and your preconceived idea of my situation (12:11-12) - Liars and worthless physicians (13:4) - Your silence would be wisdom (13:5) - The fear of God should fall on you (13:6-12) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - wisdom, might, and understanding are with God (12:13) - He controls the affairs of men (12:14, 16) - He controls nature (12:15) - He controls government and religious affairs (12:17-22) - He controls the nations (12:23-25) - I know all these things - but it isn't helping (13:1-2) - I don't want to argue with you, I want my case to go before God (13:3) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - he is ready to die trusting in God (13:15) - He still holds to his innocence (13:16) - He desires to stand in God's court (13:17-19) <p>Prayer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - remove Your hand (13:21) - Call and I'll speak to You (13:22) - Show me my sin so I can repent (13:23) - Show me why You consider me Your enemy (13:24-28) - God is in control of life - challenging the meaning of what is happening to him (14:1-12) - Job wants to be hidden from God's wrath (14:13-17) - Complaint about the hopelessness of his situation (14:18-22)
