- -609 BC
  - Jehoahaz (Joahaz, Shallum) (II Kings 23:30-33)
    - Became king
    - Reigned for 3 months
    - Taken captive by Pharaoh Neco
    - Pharaoh taxed the land and put Jehoiakim on the throne
  - Jehoiakim (Eliakim) takes over as king (II Kings 24:1-7)
    - Being taxed by Pharaoh Neco
    - Under Babylon for 3 years and then rebelled
    - 605 BC 1st siege
      - Daniel and friends taken (royal family, nobles, youths, no defect, good-looking, intelligent, wise useful to the Babylonian court) (Daniel 1:3-4)
    - -604 BC Baruch writes and reads scroll to the officials
    - He dies and Jehoiachin takes his place
- 597 BC
  - Jehoiachin (Coniah, Jeconiah) (II Kings 24:8-16)
    - king for 3 months (at 8 years old)
    - Went out to king of Babylon, his servants were besieging the city taken back to Babylon in captivity
    - 597 BC 2nd siege
      - Jehoiachin, his mother and servants, captains, and officials were taken captive
      - Neb took the treasures of the Lord's house and of Solomon's house
      - Ezekiel and 10,000 taken captive (craftsmen, smiths, mighty men of valor

- Zedekiah (Mattaniah) - appointed to take over as king (II Kings 24:17-20)

- Rebelled against king of Babylon
- In his 9th year 588 to the 11th year 586 Neb built siege wall around Jerusalem and besieged the city
- Severe famine
- 586 BC
  - 3rd siege (II Kings 25)
    - After 1 1/2 years they break the walls and sit in the gates
    - Zedekiah tries to flee at night
      - Caught killed his sons and his noble men and then blinded him
      - Put him in fetters and brought him to Babylon
    - City burned
    - Walls torn down
    - Took all bronze out of the house of the Lord and anything else that was left
    - Nebuzaradan was left in charge of those who were left
      - All who resisted were killed
      - All who were left were taken to Babylon except for the poorest in the land left to tend the vineyards and plow the fields
      - Jeremiah decided to stay even though offered a nice place to stay in Babylon
    - Gedaliah was made governor (22-24)
- 562 Evil-merodach king of Babylon releases Jehoiachin from prison
  - He stayed in Babylon with the king and held high position (II Kings 25:27-30)
