<p>We died to sin (separated from sin) (6:2) Those who have been baptized into Christ have been baptized into His death (6:3) Buried with Him so that we may be raised with Him to walk in newness of life (6:4) Our old self was crucified with Him in order that our body of sin might be done away with so we would no longer be slaves to sin (6:5-6) He who died is freed from sin (6:7) If we have died with Christ we shall live with Him (6:8) Christ was raised from the dead never to die again - death no longer is master over Him (6:9) Death that He died He died to sin, once for all, life He lives He lives to God (6:10) Sin shall not be master over you, you are not under law but under grace (6:14)</p>	<p>Consider ourselves dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ (6:11) Do not let sin reign in your mortal body (6:12) Don't go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness BUT Present yourselves to God as those alive from the dead and your members instruments of righteousness to God (6:13)</p>	<p>The answer is NO! (15) We are slaves to the one we obey - either sin resulting in death or of obedience resulting in righteousness (16) Were slaves of sin - you became obedient from the heart becoming slaves of righteousness (6:17-18) Slaves to impurity and to lawlessness - instead we want to present our members to righteousness results in sanctification (19) When slaves to sin we were not bound by righteousness (20) To be slaves to sin the result is death (21) To be freed from sin - enslaved to God - sanctification the outcome is eternal life (22) Free gift of God - eternal in Christ Jesus (6:23)</p>	<p>Present our members as slaves to righteousness resulting in sanctification (6:19)</p>

<p>Who died? - we died (true believer - someone who obeys God - do the will of the Father Mt 7:21) Ro 6:2</p> <p>What? We died to sin (6:2) Old self was crucified with Him (6:6) Freed from the power of sin (6:7) We died to being slaves to sin - became obedient (6:17) Freed from sin enslaved to God (6:22)</p> <p>Result = Sanctification</p> <p>How? We were baptized into Christ's death (6:3) Buried with Him in His death (6:4) United with Him in His death - resurrected with Him in life (newness of life) (6:5)</p>	<p>As Christ was raised we too will be raised to walk in newness of life (6:4)</p> <p>Our body of sin would be done away with and we should not longer be slaves to sin (6:6)</p> <p>Christ was raised never to die again - death no longer is master over Him (6:9)</p> <p>He died to sin once for all the life He lives, He lives to God (6:10)</p> <p>Sin is not master over us (6:14) (Gen 4:7)</p>	<p>When we repented (turned away from the sin/old life/idols to the new life/God) II Cor 7:10</p> <p>We die when we recognize our sin, repent, and turn</p>	<p>Consider yourselves dead to sin and alive in Christ (6:11)</p> <p>Do not let sin reign in your mortal body (6:12)</p> <p>Present yourselves to God as alive from the dead and your members as instruments of righteousness (6:13)</p> <p>Present yourselves as slaves to obedience (6:16)</p> <p>Result = Sanctification</p>
