<ul> <li>Valiant warrior, but he was the son of Gilead and a harlot (1)</li> <li>Brothers drive him away (2)</li> <li>Worthless men gathered around him (3)</li> <li>When the Ammonites came - they went looking for Jephthah (4-6)</li> <li>Men of Gilead made Jephthah their chief (11)</li> <li>History lesson is given to Ammon (12-28)</li> <li>Spirit of the Lord came upon Him (29)</li> <li>Why does Jephthah make a vow? (30-40) - manipulating God</li> <li>Lev 1:3-9 - priests made the offerings</li> <li>Dt 18:10 - no place for human sacrifice</li> <li>Lv 27 - vows could be redeemed</li> <li>Did what was right in his own eyes - didn't understand God or God's character</li> <li>Jephthah battles against Ephraim (12:1-6) - killed 42,000 Ephraimites</li> <li>Lessons for the church</li> <li>shouldn't pick up the sword against our brothers</li> <li>Pr 15:1 - speak gently</li> <li>Ro 5:1 - peace of God that should be in our hearts (12:18)</li> <li>Eph 4:1-3 - be diligent to preserve the unity in peace (were not called to produce it)</li> <li>People need to know the word of God (Hos 4:6; Jer 5:4; Pro 29:18; Ps 119)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Num 30 - vows are not to be taken lightly</li> <li>Lev 22:17-25 - vows are help in high esteem and sealed with a perfect sacrifice</li> <li>Ecc 5:1-7 - don't be hasty in word or impulsive in thought; let your words be few - the voice of a fool uses many words; don't be late in paying a vow; better not to vow than to vow and not pay</li> <li>Ps 15:2 - walk in integrity, work righteousness, speak truth in our hearts</li> <li>Lev 27 - each vow is valued - it can be redeemed by adding 20%</li> <li>What did Jephthah do?</li> <li>He 11:32-24 - by faith they conquered kingdoms, performed acts of righteousness, obtained promises</li> <li>I Sam12:6-11 - credited with delivering the people so they could live securely</li> <li>Mt 5:33-37 (James 5:12)</li> <li>don't make false vows</li> <li>Let your yes be yes and your no be no</li> <li>Be a person of integrity</li> </ul>	Ibzan - #H78 - whiteness - from Bethlehem - Judged 7 years - 30 sons and 30 daughters - brought outsiders to them - Many ties or alliances with others - Tremendous influence  Elon - #H356 - mighty - like an oak tree or grove - strength, wisdom, endurance - from Zebulun - Judged for 10 years  Abdon - #H5658 - servile or servitude - son of Hillel the Pirathonite - From Ephraim - Had 40 sons, 30 grandsons that rode on 70 donkeys - Judged 8 years - Man of wealth with large family and possessions
