<p>1-4</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - remember God's leading for 40 years - Humbling them, testing them - would they obey <p>5-10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - disciplining them - correcting their attitude before they came into the land - Good land - food - Iron and copper <p>11-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - don't forget God - Self-sufficiency makes it easy to forget God - Pride - root of forgetfulness - God gave you the power to make the wealth - IF YOU EVER FORGET - you will perish 	<p>1-3 - God is going before you as a consuming fire</p> <p>4-5 - it is not for your righteousness but for their wickedness that I am giving you this land</p> <p>6-14 - they are stubborn and rebellious - remember the tablets of stone and their idol</p> <p>15-29</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Moses pleading on behalf of the people - Rehearsing God's promises - Remembering how God's power would be seen by the nations - Provoking the Lord (22-24) <p>Taberah (Num 11:1-3) - "burning"</p> <p>Massah (Ex 17:1-7) - "testing"</p> <p>Kibroth-hattaavah (Nu 11:31-35) - "graves of craving"</p>	<p>1-5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Moses makes 2 tablets and God writes His commands again - They were put in the ark of the covenant <p>6-9</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Levi is chosen as God's servants - They have no inheritance in the land <p>10-11 - Moses beseeches God not to destroy Israel</p> <p>12-22</p> <p>What does God want?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - fear the Lord, walk in His ways, love Him, serve Him, keep His commandments - Circumcise your heart, cling to God <p>Attributes of God</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - God of heaven and earth, love of God, great and mighty, awesome - God of gods, Lord of lords - Executes justice - He is your praise 	<p>1-7</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - love and obey - You have seen God's power - Examples of those who rebel and don't keep God's commands - Dathan and Abiram (rebellion of Korah - Num 16) <p>8-12</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - keep the commands and you will be strong in the land - Description of land compared to Egypt - God provides the rains in this good land <p>13-17</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - blessed with rain when you obey - God's anger will be kindled when you serve other gods <p>18-25</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - impress these words on your hearts - Impress them on the children <p>26-32 - blessing and a curse - be careful</p>	<p>1-7</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - utterly destroy everything that has to do with pagan worship - Don't mix their religions with your relationship with God - Bring their contributions to God - where He chooses <p>8-14</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - don't be doing right in your eyes - Do what is right in God's eyes - They need to bring their offerings where God chooses <p>15-28</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - different rules for eating meat for you family versus putting aside animals for offerings - Offerings are only made where God shows you <p>29-32</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - whatever God commands - do - don't add or take away

<p>1-5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - if you love God you will walk in His ways - Prophet or dreamer - needs to be 100% accurate - counseling rebellion against God - Purge the evil from our midst <p>6-11</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - even if you friends or family try to seduce you away from God, you are to kill them - Expose them for what they are <p>12-18</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - confusion - counseled rebellion - Worthless men leading rebellion in a city - the city follows - burn it all - people, city, booty, animals 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Cutting yourself and shaving your head (Jer 16:6; Lev 19:27-28; 21:1-5; I Kings 18:28) <p>Land animals (3-8)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - split hoof and chew its cud - These you can eat <p>Fish - have to have fins and scales (9-10)</p> <p>Birds (11-20)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - don't eat (12-18) - Anything that's clean <p>21</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - nothing that dies on its own - Don't boil young goat in its mother's milk <p>Tithing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - in the presence of the Lord - In God's place of His choosing <p>Levite - don't neglect them with your offering</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - every 3rd year tithe was brought to your town - Levite, alien, orphan, widow 	<p>1-6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - remission of debts on the 7th year - There will be no poor among you if you listen to the voice of the Lord - You will rule over other and lend to other nations <p>7-11</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - don't harden your heart against the poor - Giving generously <p>12-17</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - when a brother is set free from serving you - don't send him away empty handed - Bond-servant - someone who voluntarily stays in the service of a loving master <p>18 - slave has given you double service</p> <p>19-23</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - firstborn of flock and herd is God's - given where God chooses - Firstborn would be sacrificed once a year 	<p>1-8 - Passover</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Passover, Unleavened Bread, First Fruits - Needs to be celebrated in the place of God's choosing - Remembering of coming out of Egypt - set free <p>9-12 - Feast of Weeks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - count off 7 weeks (49 days) - Pentecost - Freewill offering - Time of rejoicing <p>13-15 - Feast of Booths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - after the gathering of the threshing floor and wine vat - Time of rejoicing <p>16-17 - 3 times a year that the men had to appear before the Lord</p> <p>18-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - appointing judges - Fairness - Pursue justice <p>21-22 - don't set up false worship</p>	<p>1-7</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Purging evil from your midst - God gets out very best - Anyone serving other gods it to be taken out and stoned - Witnesses (2-3) to testify <p>8-13</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - if a case is too difficult - it is taken to the priest or judge before God - They will declare the verdict - You will act accordingly - The man who doesn't will be killed <p>14-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - when you choose a king - Shall not multiply horses, wives, gold and silver - Write a copy of this law on a scroll - Read it all the days of his life - Fear God and observe His words

<p>1-2 - the Levites have no portion of inheritance</p> <p>3-5 - priests had a right to portions of the animals that were sacrificed, first fruits, grain, wine, oil, shearing of the sheep</p> <p>6-8 - he shall serve in the name of the Lord</p> <p>9-14 - don't imitate the detestable things</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - human sacrifice - Divination - Witchcraft - Omens - Sorcerers - #G5331 - pharmakeia - Cast of spells - Mediums - Spiritists - Those who call up the dead <p>15-22 - a prophet coming</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Dt 34:10-12 - great prophet - One of them - Israelite - Acts 3:22-23; Jn 1:21, 25; 6:14; 7:40 - Jesus speaks for the Father (Jn 8:42; 5:18-20; 12:49; 14:10; He 1:3) - False prophets - don't speak God's words 	<p>1-3 - set aside 3 cities of refuge in the land when the cross the Jordan</p> <p>4-7 - someone who kills unintentionally</p> <p>8-10 - if they loved the Lord and walked in His ways - He would expand their land and they were to set up three additional cities of refuge</p> <p>11-13 - if some kills intentionally - if he gets to these cities - he will be turned out to the blood avenger</p> <p>14 - don't move the boundary markers</p> <p>15-21</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - need 2-3 witnesses for someone to be held guilty - A malicious witness was to be dealt with severely - No pity was to be taken - People would see and be afraid 	<p>1-9</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - do not be afraid - The Lord God is with them! - Remember that God brought you out of the land of Egypt - Priests - victory was linked to their faith is - Officers - they tell the men to go home if their mind is not on the battle - II Tim 2:3-5 - minds needed to be clear to serve God as He called them to serve <p>10-18</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - when approaching a city outside their inheritance - offer them peace - They can become your forced labor - If they don't accept peace kill the men - but women and children and the spoils can be kept - If the city is in the inheritance - they are to be completely destroyed <p>19-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - don't cut down the fruit trees 	<p>1-9</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - someone has been killed and their body found out in the field - Find closest city - Offer a sacrifice in the valley with running water - Wash their hands over the sacrifice with the broken neck - they are not guilty of this innocent blood - Ask God's forgiveness on behalf of Israel - They would be forgiven when they do what is right in the sight of the Lord <p>10-14</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - beautiful woman among the captives and you want her as a wife - She needs to shave head and cut nails, remove her old clothes, mourn her parents for a month - Then she can become your wife - Let her go wherever she wishes, don't sell her, don't mistreat her <p>15-17 - maintaining the rights of the firstborn even if it is an unloved wife</p> <p>18-21</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - rebellious son - this is a pattern of his life - drunkenness and gluttony - Stone him to remove evil <p>22-23 - a person hung on a tree needed to be taken down before nightfall</p>

Jesus and Moses Compared (Prophet like Moses)

- Both spared as a baby (Ex 2; Mt 2:13-23)
- Renounced a royal court (Phil 2:5-8; He 11:24-27)
- Both had compassion on his people (Nu 27:17; Mt 9:36)
- Made intercession for the people (Dt 9:18-19; He 7:25)
- Spoke with God face to face (Ex 34:29-30; Dt 34:10; II Cor 3:7)
- Both a mediator of the covenant - Moses the Covenant of Law - Jesus the New Covenant in His blood (Dt 29:1; He 8:6-7)
