<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 70 came (1-5) - They became a swarm (numerous) - the land was filled with them <p>6-10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - new king - didn't know Joseph - Jumping from 12th dynasty to 18th - 1804 BC-1525 BC - Exodus occurs 1445 BC (80 yrs after the birth of Moses) - The people are more numerous than Egyptians <p>11-14</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - enslave the nation - The more the inflicted them the more they grew <p>15-18</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - midwives were told to kill the boys - They feared God more than Pharaoh and didn't do it <p>19-22</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - midwives said the the Hebrew women were vigorous - God protects the people - babies and the midwives - God is growing the nation of Israel in the womb of Egypt 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - family of Levi (priestly line) - Child is born and hidden for 3 months (he was circumcised, he became too loud to hide) - Put the baby in a basket in the reeds by the bank (3) - Specifically put it where the Pharaoh's household would come (4) - Pharaoh's daughter takes him in (5-6) - The mother continued to take care of the child until he grew and was taken back to Pharaoh's daughter (7-10) - She called him Moses (10) - Heb 11:24-29 - Moses refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter - Moses sees the abuse of his people and kills an Egyptian who was beating one of his brethren (11-14) - Moses escapes for his life and he goes to the land of Midian (15) - The daughters that Moses helped thought he was Egyptian (16-19) - Moses stays in Midian and marries Zipporah and has a son (20-22) - A new king come to Egypt's throne and oppresses the Israelites even more (23-25) - God is about to move to keep the covenant promise to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - God calls Moses out of a burning bush (1-6) - God calls Moses by name and tells him to remove sandals for this is holy ground - Moses was afraid and hid his face - God sees all that is happening to His people (7-9) <p>God's mission for Moses</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - bring the people out to Egypt (10) - 1st objection - Who am I that I should do this (11) - God's promise - I will be with you (12) - The people are to be brought to this mountain (Horeb) and worship God there (12) - rescued from bondage to become worshippers of God (I Thes 1:9) - 2nd objection - Who am I going to say sent me (13) - God's response - I AM who I AM - I AM sent you (14) - God tells him how all this is going to work (15-22) - Pharaoh is going to hold control over these people at all cost - There is the promise of leaving the land with great wealth and riches (22) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 3rd objection - what if they don't believe me? - God's response - I will give you signs to prove that you are My spokesmen (2-9) - Purpose of the signs was to authenticate that Moses was indeed God's spokesman - Serpent from the staff (2-5) - Leprous hand (6-8) - Water turns to blood (9) - 4th objection - I am slow of speech and slow of tongue (10) - God responds with 3 questions - who made your mouth? Who makes someone mute or deaf who makes seeing or blind? Isn't it the Lord? (11) - God will be with his mouth and teach him what to say (12) - Moses tells God to send anyone as long as it isn't him (13) - The anger of the Lord burned against Moses (14) - Even in God's anger He was still willing to use Moses and gave Aaron as his mouthpiece (15-17) - Moses would be the one in the higher position - speaking for God - keep the staff (17) - Moses shows respect to his father-in-law (18-20) - God tells Moses that He will harden Pharaoh's heart and he will not let the people go (21) - Pharaoh was given a warning but was going to refuse (23) - 10 times God says that He will harden Pharaoh's heart - 10 times Scriptures says that Pharaoh hardened his own heart - There is always a balance - God's will and man's choice (Ro 9:14-33; 11:11-36) - 24-26 - Moses was a Hebrew - he was circumcised - he would have understood the importance of it - 27-31- God - Moses - Aaron - elders of the people - bowed and worshipped God
