<p>1-4            - remember God's leading for 40 years            - Humbling them, testing them - would they obey</p> <p>5-10            - disciplining them            - correcting their attitude before they came into the land            - Good land - food            - Iron and copper</p> <p>11-20            - don't forget God            - Self-sufficiency makes it easy to forget God            - Pride - root of forgetfulness            - God gave you the power to make the wealth            - IF YOU EVER FORGET - you will perish</p>	<p>1-3 - God is going before you as a consuming fire            4-5 - it is not for your righteousness but for their wickedness that I am giving you this land</p> <p>6-14 - they are stubborn and rebellious - remember the tablets of stone and their idol</p> <p>15-29            - Moses pleading on behalf of the people            - Rehearsing God's promises            - Remembering how God's power would be seen by the nations            - Provoking the Lord (22-24)</p> <p>Taberah (Num 11:1-3) - "burning"            Massah (Ex 17:1-7) - "testing"            Kibroth-hattaavah (Nu 11:31-35) - "graves of craving"</p>	<p>1-5            - Moses makes 2 tablets and God writes His commands again            - They were put in the ark of the covenant</p> <p>6-9            - Levi is chosen as God's servants            - They have no inheritance in the land</p> <p>10-11 - Moses beseeches God not to destroy Israel</p> <p>12-22            What does God want?            - fear the Lord, walk in His ways, love Him, serve Him, keep His commandments            - Circumcise your heart, cling to God</p> <p>Attributes of God            - God of heaven and earth, love of God, great and mighty, awesome</p> <p>- God of gods, Lord of lords            - Executes justice            - He is your praise</p>	<p>1-7            - love and obey            - You have seen God's power            - Examples of those who rebel and don't keep God's commands - Dathan and Abiram (rebellion of Korah - Num 16)</p> <p>8-12            - keep the commands and you will be strong in the land            - Description of land compared to Egypt            - God provides the rains in this good land</p> <p>13-17            - blessed with rain when you obey            - God's anger will be kindled when you serve other gods</p> <p>18-25            - impress these words on your hearts            - Impress them on the children</p> <p>26-32 - blessing and a curse - be careful</p>	<p>1-7            - utterly destroy everything that has to do with pagan worship            - Don't mix their religions with your relationship with God</p> <p>8-14            - don't be doing right in your eyes            - Do what is right in God's eyes            - They need to bring their offerings where God chooses</p> <p>15-28            - different rules for eating meat for you family versus putting aside animals for offerings            - Offerings are only made where God shows you</p> <p>29-32            - whatever God commands - do - don't add or take away</p>

<p>1-5</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- if you love God you will walk in His ways</li> <li>- Prophet or dreamer - needs to be 100% accurate - counseling rebellion against God</li> <li>- Purge the evil from our midst</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Cutting yourself and shaving your head (Jer 16:6; Lev 19:27-28; 21:1-5; I Kings 18:28)</li> <li>Land animals (3-8) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- split hoof and chew its cud</li> <li>- These you can eat</li> </ul> </li> <li>Fish - have to have fins and scales (9-10)</li> <li>Birds (11-20) <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- don't eat (12-18)</li> <li>- Anything that's clean</li> </ul> </li> <li>21 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- nothing that dies on its own</li> <li>- Don't boil young goat in its mother's milk</li> </ul> </li> <li>Tithing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- in the presence of the Lord</li> <li>- In God's place of His choosing</li> </ul> </li> <li>Levite - don't neglect them with your offering <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- every 3rd year tithe was brought to your town - Levite, alien, orphan, widow</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p>1-6</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- remission of debts on the 7th year</li> <li>- There will be no poor among you if you listen to the voice of the Lord</li> <li>- You will rule over other and lend to other nations</li> </ul> <p>7-11</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- don't harden your heart against the poor</li> <li>- Giving generously</li> </ul> <p>12-17</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- when a brother is set free from serving you - don't send him away empty handed</li> <li>- Bond-servant - someone who voluntarily stays in the service of a loving master</li> </ul> <p>18 - slave has given you double service</p> <p>19-23</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- firstborn of flock and herd is God's - given where God chooses</li> <li>- Firstborn would be sacrificed once a year</li> </ul>	<p>1-8 - Passover</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Passover, Unleavened Bread, First Fruits</li> <li>- Needs to be celebrated in the place of God's choosing</li> <li>- Remembering of coming out of Egypt <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- set free</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>9-12 - Feast of Weeks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- count off 7 weeks (49 days)</li> <li>- Pentecost</li> <li>- Freewill offering</li> <li>- Time of rejoicing</li> </ul> <p>13-15 - Feast of Booths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- after the gathering of the threshing floor and wine vat</li> <li>- Time of rejoicing</li> </ul> <p>16-17 - 3 times a year that the men had to appear before the Lord</p> <p>18-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- appointing judges</li> <li>- Fairness</li> <li>- Pursue justice</li> </ul> <p>21-22 - don't set up false worship</p>	<p>1-7</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Purging evil from your midst</li> <li>- God gets out very best</li> <li>- Anyone serving other gods it to be taken out and stoned</li> <li>- Witnesses (2-3) to testify</li> </ul> <p>8-13</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- if a case is too difficult <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- it is taken to the priest or judge before God</li> </ul> </li> <li>- They will declare the verdict</li> <li>- You will act accordingly</li> <li>- The man who doesn't will be killed</li> </ul> <p>14-20</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- when you choose a king</li> <li>- Shall not multiply horses, wives, gold and silver</li> <li>- Write a copy of this law on a scroll</li> <li>- Read it all the days of his life</li> <li>- Fear God and observe His words</li> </ul>

<p>1-2 - the Levites have no portion of inheritance</p> <p>3-5 - priests had a right to portions of the animals that were sacrificed, first fruits, grain, wine, oil, shearing of the sheep</p> <p>6-8 - he shall serve in the name of the Lord</p> <p>9-14 - don't imitate the detestable things</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- human sacrifice</li> <li>- Divination</li> <li>- Witchcraft</li> <li>- Omens</li> <li>- Sorcerers - #G5331 - pharmakeia</li> <li>- Cast of spells</li> <li>- Mediums</li> <li>- Spiritists</li> <li>- Those who call up the dead</li> </ul> <p>15-22 - a prophet coming</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Dt 34:10-12 - great prophet</li> <li>- One of them - Israelite</li> <li>- Acts 3:22-23; Jn 1:21, 25; 6:14; 7:40</li> <li>- Jesus speaks for the Father (Jn 8:42; 5:18-20; 12:49; 14:10; He 1:3)</li> <li>- False prophets - don't speak God's words</li> </ul>	<p>1-3 - set aside 3 cities of refuge in the land when they cross the Jordan</p> <p>4-7 - someone who kills unintentionally</p> <p>8-10 - if they loved the Lord and walked in His ways - He would expand their land and they were to set up three additional cities of refuge</p> <p>11-13 - if someone kills intentionally - if he gets to these cities - he will be turned out to the blood avengerer</p>		

**Jesus and Moses Compared (Prophet like Moses)**

- Both spared as a baby (Ex 2; Mt 2:13-23)
- Renounced a royal court (Phil 2:5-8; He 11:24-27)
- Both had compassion on his people (Nu 27:17; Mt 9:36)
- Made intercession for the people (Dt 9:18-19; He 7:25)
- Spoke with God face to face (Ex 34:29-30; Dt 34:10; II Cor 3:7)
- Both a mediator of the covenant - Moses the Covenant of Law - Jesus the New Covenant in His blood (Dt 29:1; He 8:6-7)
