## **Spring Has Sprung**

I will begin with the happy but sad news first. On February 19, 2023, my sister Bonnie went home to be with the Lord, one month before her 68th birthday. She was hospitalized in January after being found unconscious. About three weeks into her hospital stay I got a call from her, booked a ticket and headed for Florida. I sat with her in the hospital and fought with doctors, nurses, and hospital staff on her behalf. She was released on hospice care to her daughter's home. I slept in the room with her reading, praying, listening to instrumental hymns at night. Four days later she left this life. She was ready to go. We had the joy of watching her life change about six years ago when she gave her heart to the Lord. We rejoice that her pain and suffering is over, but it is hard not having my sister to talk to anymore!

In our last letter we shared that we had the opportunity to go to the "River of Lights" with Jeremy, Sarah, and the four kids. If we go next year, there will be five grandkids. They shared with us that night that they were expecting, and we just found out that they are going to have a boy in the beginning of August if all goes well.

Overwhelmed would probably not be a strong enough word for Jimmy's new job as Sheriff. He has certainly run into many obstacles already as he tries to stand in the gap for the community he serves. While he tries to stay afloat in the world of politics, someone told him not to think of himself as a politician, instead he is a community leader. With God's help, that is what he would like to do!

### **Busy Schedule**

I shared that we would not be holding a Seder this year because of our schedule. Let me give you a quick glance at our first quarter of 2023. At the beginning of the year, Jim and I were still trying to regain strength and stamina after being sick. My sister called daily to check up on us because there were literally days that we couldn't move. Then she was admitted to the hospital in January and now the focus and concern was on her. In February I flew to FL leaving my loving husband at home to keep things running here. I knew I was going until my sister passed. We did the best we could to prepare for a long stay. Two weeks later I was home again. Since I teach science to high school students, and they need a certain amount of hours in order to obtain credit. Upon returning, we needed to put in extra time to make up for the hours they missed. In February I was scheduled for a trip to PA to spend some time with my mother and help her with some projects around the house. That trip was moved to April 5th. I will be gone another week. In May, I return to FL to wrap up a couple more things that revolve around my sister. Three months, three trips, and science classes being squeezed in between has made for a very hectic schedule! Lord willing, things should slow down after May!

- Little by little Jim and I are getting back on our feet and accomplishing some of what we used to be able to do.
- The time that I was able to be with my sister before she passed. We talked in our room at night. We laughed, we cried, and we had ample time to say a proper goodbye. I was blessed to be there for her and for her family.
- We have been blessed and encouraged by the Bible studies we are leading as well as the encouragement we are hearing from the students. We are hearing stories of overcoming obstacles, standing strong in the face of persecution, and drawing on God's Word to change lives. There have been many positive stories, but we have seen others who have come for help, been given God's solution, and have chosen instead to continue to walk their own way, rejecting God's power to change their life. We pray that in some way, God will get ahold of their hearts!
- We have talked with Kevin and heard of his struggles and his victories. How thankful we are

- to see a man of God standing and proclaiming God's truth, even when others cast aspersions. What an encouragement he has been to us!
- Jeremy and family had a great family trip together to rain drenched CA. Although the weather wasn't great, they were able to make the best of it, and they decided to do a gender reveal on the beach with just their family. It looked like a special time for all of them.
- Jimmy has gotten through his first 90 days as Sheriff. Although he looks at all the things that haven't gotten done yet, he is remembering and recording all the things that have and has taken encouragement in the accomplishments thus far.
