<ul> <li>Abimelech - My father is king</li> <li>Gideon - passes his attitude on to his son</li> <li>Makes himself king (2)</li> <li>Evil dictator who killed his own brothers</li> <li>Jotham escapes</li> <li>Abimelech is crowned as king</li> </ul> People would soon demand a king I Sam 8:4-22; 10:17-19 <ul> <li>they desired a king like all the nations had</li> <li>They rejected God as their king</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Trees wanted a king</li> <li>Olive tree - can't leave it's fruit by which God and man are honored</li> <li>Fig tree - can't leave its sweetness and good fruit</li> <li>Grape vine - can't leave my new wine which cheers God and man</li> <li>Bramble - wasn't doing anything, not productive - come use my shade, I will be king or I will burn it all down</li> <li>Trees = men of Shechem</li> <li>Bramble = Abimelech</li> <li>If you have treated Gideon's house well - rejoice</li> <li>If not Abimelech will destroy you and you will destroy Abimelech</li> <li>Abimelech destroy Shechem and Shechem destroyed Abimelech (45-57)</li> <li>Abimelech did what was right in his own eyes - made himself king Gideon did what was right in his own eyes - made himself priest (king)</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>1-5 - Tola (#H8439)</li> <li>Tola = worm that springs rom purification</li> <li>Son of Puah, son of Dodo</li> <li>Issachar</li> <li>Arose to save Israel</li> <li>Lived in hill country of Ephraim</li> <li>Judged 23 years</li> <li>I Chron 7:1-5 (Gen 46:13) - mighty men of valor</li> <li>Jair - #H2971</li> <li>Jair = he enlightens</li> <li>Gileadite - Num 32:41 - Manasseh</li> <li>Judged for 22 years</li> <li>He is on the wrong side of the river</li> <li>30 sons, 30 donkeys, 30 cities - in the land of Gilead</li> <li>Man of influence, power, money</li> <li>6-18</li> <li>forsake God and serve other gods</li> <li>God raised up Philistines &amp; Ammon - 18 years</li> <li>God tells them to cry out to their chosen gods</li> <li>Repented</li> <li>confessed their sin</li> <li>Forsake the sin</li> <li>Served the Lord (I Thes 1:9)</li> </ul>

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Jephthah (11-12)  - Valiant warrior and the son of a harlot (1) - Brothers drove him out (2) - Worthless men gathered with him (3) - He was put in position as head of Gilead (11) - Tries to reason with the king of Ammon (12) - History lesson (15-26) - Spirit of the Lord comes upon him (29) - He makes an unnecessary vow - manipulate God (30-40) - If we win - then I will offer (31) - Burnt offerings - made by the priests for atonement (Lev 1:3-9) - No place for human sacrifice (Dt 18:10) - Vows could be redeemed (Lev 27) - He did according to what he vowed (39) - vs 35 "Alas" - he cannot take his vow back  Jephthah did what was right in his own eyes - did not understand God's Word nor His character		
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
