1-26 - the people went to their territories and began driving out the inhabitants of the land - Judah could not drive out the people in the valley because of their iron chariots (19) 27-36 - they could not drive out the people They could not drive out the people from the land because they would not drive the people from the land - Josh 23:12-13	 1-5 the people are not obeying what God commanded to do God refuses to drive out the people - this is part of the covenant that was made They went from a place of victory (Gilgal) to a place of mourning (Bochim) 6-10 Joshua and his generation die There arose a new generation that did not know the Lord or the work which He had done for Israel 11-23 people did evil - served the Baals (other gods) Forsook the Lord Followed other gods (gods of the land) God's anger burned against them - withdrew His blessing He gave them into the hands of their enemies Cried out to God God raised up judges Judge would deliver them Judge dies People went back and acted even more corruptly in the sight of God 	 3:1-8 nations were left in the land to test the people These are the Israelites who haven't known war (or the power of God to deliver them) were now going to experience God at work They would be tested to find out if they would obey the commands of the Lord The Israelites intermarried with the nations and served their gods They forgot the Lord Who were the judges #1 - Moses (Ex 18:13, 17-26) #2 - Joshua (Dt 31:1-8; Josh 23:1-13) #3 - 13 Judges listed in Judges 3-16 over a 300+ year time frame #4, 5 - Samuel, Eli (I Sam 4:18; 7:6, 15-16) Judges 21:25 - there was no king in Israel and everyone did what was right in his own eyes
